### **Eager Hall, BS, RPh, Health Educator & Pharmacist—Medical Team 2**



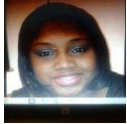

Inspired by his mother and his teacher’s vote of confidence, he soared against the odds and became a high school teacher and later a Certified Family Life and Social Skill Educator. Today, Mr. Chitan is the President/CEO of Motiv-8 for Change International, and an International Lifestyle Enhancement Educator. He has fulfilled the prediction of his teacher that his career path would have something to do with public speaking. He has matured into a powerful high impact no-nonsense speaker whose presentations have initiated change in the lives of over 200, 000 children, youth and adults across Canada, five US States, Africa, and the Caribbean.

#### **Purpose of the Mission Trip**

The purpose of the mission trip was to make a contribution towards improving the lives of Grenadians at home and to provide an opportunity for Grenadians at home and abroad to give back to their beloved homeland.

#### **Background**

The idea for the mission grew out of the recognition that there is an urgent need for healthcare, health education and health-related services in the tri-island state of Grenada, Carriacou and Petit Martinique. Grenada's estimated population is a little more than 100,000. The average life expectancy is 73 years and it is estimated that the population aged 65 and older will increase by 10% over the next decade; a factor that will further strain the islands' scarce health resources. According to Grenada's Ministry of Health, the leading causes of illness and death are diabetes, cancer, strokes and heart disease. Studies also show that much of

these diseases are directly related to lifestyle, which can be modified to incorporate healthier practices.

### **Who are Involved**

This GNYAO in collaboration with the Grenada Ministry of Health, St. George's University, and the Grenada Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, the Grenada Toronto Community Network, and Motiv-8 for Change International organized this health mission effort.
